NAD Remote Code to Pronto - v1.09

This program is used to generate Pronto remote codes for NAD products. The desired NAD command can be selected from a list, and the Pronto code will be displayed. The file NADtoPronto.exe can be placed and run from any folder on your computer.

How to Use This Program

When the NADtoPronto.exe program is run, a simple window will appear with two list boxes. Commands can be displayed either by Model or by Command Set. Select the radio box to switch views.

From the Command Set view, select the appropriate command set from the list box on the left. For example, if you want codes for a T534 DVD player, select the item "T512, T513, T514, T524, T531, T532, T533, T534, T571, T572". After making a selection the list box on the right will display the available commands. Selecting a command will cause the Pronto code to be displayed in the text box at the bottom of the window. If the "Auto copy Pronto code to clipboard" option is checked, the Pronto code will also be placed on the clipboard so it can be easily pasted into the Pronto software.

The model view gives all the IR commands for the currently selected model. Use the same method described above for obtaining the Pronto code. Also note, some models now support IR channels, if the currently selected model supports this feature the IR Channel drop down box will be enabled. IR channels allow you to use the same commands to control different receivers and/or zones.

How to Use the Pronto Code

The properties window for buttons in the Pronto software consists of several "tabs". Select the "Action" tab to see a list of the remote codes assigned to the button. If you double click on an item in this list a window will open which displays a string of numbers. By default, the string will be already selected and you can just press "Ctrl+V" to replace it with the clipboard contents. If there are no codes already in the Action list or you wish to add another, the quickest way is to click the "RC5/6" button and then just click OK on the window that appears. Please refer to the documentation for your remote control for more information on how to use the remote codes.
